Visitors to the Temple Israel Museum told the staff that a Jewish ancestor named Louis Goldman lived in Leadville at some point during the 1880s. Unfortunately, we have no vital records on Louis, making him difficult to identify. What we do have, however, are possibly two Louis/Lewis Goldmans who lived or worked in Leadville and Gunnison County between 1879 and 1880. Another possibility is that they were the same person working in different professions in different locations over the course of two years. The first mention of a Louis Goldman in Leadville appears in the 1879 city directory that lists him as a carpenter residing at Lafayette Avenue.¹ Nothing else is known about him. The second allusion to a Louis Goldman in Leadville comes in 1880, at which time local newspapers reported that he sold mine shares on three separate occasions, once in March² and twice³ in April.⁴ That same Louis Goldman is also found in the 1880 US Census⁵ living in nearby Gunnison County, where he was also selling mine shares.⁶

No further information is available on Louis Goldman or his time in Leadville.
