Isaac Hattenbach Born: August 30, 1838, Hamburg, Prussia Died: August 21, 1921. Immigration: New York City, 1865

Rachel Cohn Hattenbach Born: October 22, 1859, New York City Died: January 10, 1924, Brooklyn, New York

Details on Isaac Hattenbach, his wife Rachel, and their time in Leadville are very limited. Isaac was born in Hamburg, Prussia in 1838. He immigrated to the United States through New York City in 1865.<sup>1</sup> From there Isaac seems to have taken a path westward in short segments with brief stops in New Mexico,<sup>2</sup> Central City, and Leadville, Colorado while periodically returning to New York for interim periods before settling there permanently in 1883.<sup>3</sup>

Isaac was a bachelor in 1879 when he first arrived in Leadville. He then opened shop as a saloonkeeper who operated his own storefront on the southwest corner of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and Harrison.<sup>4</sup> He did not stay in Leadville long, although he did participate in a fundraiser for the Rocky Mountain Lodge no. 322 of the Independent Order of the *B'nai B'rith* in 1879.<sup>5</sup> In the winter of 1880, Isaac returned to New York City, and married Rachel Cohn there on February 8<sup>th</sup>.<sup>6</sup> The couple does appear to have returned to Leadville briefly following their wedding and are documented residing at 322 Poplar Street in the 1880 United *State's Census*,<sup>7</sup> however the duration of time that they remained in the city is unclear. There is notice for a Lake County Court Case No. 2131 on January 31.1882, in which Isaac was given ten days to respond to a defendant's claim,<sup>8</sup> but no other records for the Hattenbachs have been found to document their time in Leadville.
