Abe Mecklenberg (sometimes Macklinburg, Mecklinberg)¹ Born: 1870 Died: December 23, 1919 Married to: Unknown/none In Leadville: 1888, 1899-1901

Abraham Mecklenberg was employed at two Leadville businesses in the late 19th century and early 20th century, including the Singer Sewing machine company in 1888 and Peltons's Famous Clothing between 1899 and 1901. Abe was born in New York in 1870. His parents were Polish immigrants, Max and Bessie Mecklinberg, who immigrated to the United States in 1868.² Abe had a younger brother named Morris who was also a Colorado resident, but never of Leadville. The family arrived in Colorado sometime between the birth of Morris in 1874 and 1884.³ A short mention in a Silver Plume newspaper from 1904 suggests that the family arrived in Silver Plume prior to "the fire" of 1884.⁴ A Leadville newspaper noted that Max "Mecklenburg" lost \$11,000 in dry goods, and had \$4,000 in insurance in the wake of the fire.⁵ In 1885, the family were enumerated as residents of an unspecified city or town in Clear Creek County. Abe's father Max appeared in the Georgetown newspaper Colorado Miner in an August 1885 edition, suggesting that the family lived in that city at the time of the census.⁶

Abe first appeared in Leadville during 1888 as a "collector" for the Singer Sewing Machine company; probably a debt collection role.⁷ His residence was not listed that year, but Singer was located at 619 Harrison Avenue and Abe probably lived at that location in a second story apartment. Outside of city directories and census records, Abe's Leadville social life is undocumented and he only appeared in a Leadville newspaper after he had left the city when he visited briefly in 1902 and 1905.⁸ The 1889 Leadville city directory did not list Abe as a resident.⁹ In 1890, he was listed in a Denver City directory as a clerk.¹⁰ Abe appeared in Aspen during the middle 1890s as attested by Pikin County newspapers cited below.

Abe was socially active while he lived in Aspen between 1895 and 1897. During his two years in that city, he was listed as the secretary of the "Aspen Trades Assembly".¹¹ He visited Leadville once in 1897 while he still lived in Aspen.¹² By late 1898, he was again in Leadville, this time as an employee at the Famous Clothing store.¹³ Between 1899 and 1901, Abe was listed as a clerk. During those years, his residence was listed as room 19, 301-303 Harrison Avenue (1899), and Room 20, 301-303 Harrison (1900 and 1901).14 Rooms 19 and 20 were on the second floor of what was originally the Daniels and Fisher Block on the corner of Harrison Avenue and West 3rd Street (right). This would later become Hyman Isaacs' department store, and was destined to collapse during the spring of 1919.¹⁵ The Famous was a long-time Jewish owned clothing store which began as Sands and Pelton in 1879, continued under Herman Powell and Richard Metz in the 1880s and later existed under the frenetic leadership of Elias Pelton until at least 1919.¹⁶ The 1900 Census reveals some interesting detail of 301-303 Harrison Avenue. That year, Abe was enumerated as a resident of 301 Harrison Avenue. The upstairs residence was home to 19 boarders including Abe, as well as the building supervisors Sarah and Michael Ford and sister Maggie. Most of the boarders were natural born Americans but there were also one English, and one

Canadian immigrant, as well as five Germans and two Swedes. The majority of the boarders were salesmen and merchants; there were also several miners, bartenders, two physicians, a book keeper, one cattle dealer, and one saloon keeper.¹⁷ Nearly all the boarders were single males between the ages of 21 and 47, one was divorced, and one was a widower. There was also one 67-year-old widowed female. The location of the structure is occupied by a parking lot in 2019. Abraham left Leadville for Denver in 1901. He became a resident of Denver in 1902.¹⁸ The 1910 Census enumerated Abe, Morris, and parents Max and Bessie as residents of Downing Avenue in Denver. Abe was listed as a commercial salesman, and both Max and Morris were listed as dry goods merchants. Abe continued to work as a salesman until his death in 1919. Abe's death occurred in Queens, New York,¹⁹ probably while he was there on a business trip. He was laid to rest in Denver's Emanuel Cemetery.²⁰ There is no evidence he ever married. He is buried near his parents who outlived him by nearly 20 years; Max and Bessie both died in the 1930s.²¹
