Birth: Pennsylvania, December 14th, 1859 Death: Glendale, California, December 24th, 1946

John Sengfelder was born in Pennsylvania on December 14, 1859<sup>1</sup> to John and Elizabeth Sengfelder. He began to study candy making and the art of baking and remained in the Pennsylvania area, specifically the Philadelphia area, until reportedly making his way to Leadville in 1879 at the age of nineteen.<sup>2</sup>

Upon arriving in Leadville, John secured work as a clerk at the J. A. Smith bakery located at 424 Harrison Avenue. He resided here with several other store employees including Charlie Pfeiffer<sup>3</sup> who would soon become John's business partner. Curiously, the storefront listed J. A. Smith as the proprietor, but the 1880 United States census named J. Adamson<sup>4</sup> as the store's proprietor. Also, neither Smith nor Adamson are listed in Leadville's 1880 city directory.

By the autumn of 1880, John and Charlie acquired the shop and renamed it the Carbonate Bakery. The pair sold kosher sausages and other assorted kosher food from the storefront bakery. The earliest documentation of the Pfeiffer/Sengfelder partnership is found in the November 25, 1880 edition of the *Leadville Daily Herald*:

John and Charlie operated this enterprise together for only a few months before Sengfelder departed the company sometime in March of 1881. The last listing for Pfeiffer & Sengfelder is a grocery store, which appears in the March 3 edition of the *Leadville Democrat*:

By the time Leadville's 1881 city directory was published, the storefront had been renamed for the

new partnership between Charlie Pfeiffer and John Andrus.<sup>5</sup> John Sengfelder had moved on to the now defunct mining camp of Chloride, Colorado, located about ten miles south of Aspen, by April of 1881. There he opened the Chloride Bakery with partner H. J. Mayham.<sup>6</sup> Sengfelder either closed or divested himself of that enterprise by summer's end.<sup>7</sup>

John resurfaced in Leadville during 1882, when he is shown to be employed as a baker for Joseph Hall. Joseph and his brother, Thomas, had acquired the Carbonate Bakery and operated it at 434 Harrison Avenue.<sup>8</sup> John attended the annual ball for the Knights of Robert Emmett on October 10<sup>9</sup> and on October 17, John was present at the surprise thirtieth birthday celebration<sup>10</sup> for Professor Henry Simon.<sup>11</sup> During 1883, John moved his residence to 111 East 5<sup>th</sup> Street and remained in his position as a baker with the Hall brothers.<sup>12</sup>

John left Leadville in 1883 for Eagle, Idaho, where he briefly remained before moving on to Spokane, Washington in 1884. He remained in that city, organizing a successful local bakery store chain, a real estate enterprise, and paving companies<sup>13</sup> before moving on to southern California sometime in the late 1920s.<sup>14</sup> In addition to his membership in the Knights of Robert Emmit, he was also a member of the Elks, Oddfellows, the Spokane Club, The Inland Club, and varying factions of the Masonic Temple.<sup>15</sup>

John married Elizabeth Melvin sometime during 1888, and the couple settled in Spokane, Washington where they are found in 1900 living with their two daughters Vera and Ellen. John continued working as a baker<sup>16</sup> and lived to the ripe old age of 87. He died in Los Angeles of unknown causes on December 24, 1946.<sup>17</sup>
